Reopening Plan 2020-2021

Health Department Requirements

Canyon View Middle School and Emery County School District are working closely with the local health department to ensure the safety of our students, faculty, and staff. To do this, we will follow these requirements during the 2020-2021 school year:

- Masks or face coverings are required for everyone who enters the school building.
- Students may bring their own mask, but they must follow the dress code by not displaying any inappropriate, objectionable, or offensive material.
- If a student does not have a mask, we will provide them with a disposable one.

Classroom

- Teachers will use seating charts in every classroom to help with contact tracing.
- Teachers will sanitize the surfaces in their classrooms between each class period.
- Teachers will work to arrange their classrooms in a way that encourages social distancing to the extent possible.
- Masks or face coverings will be worn in the classroom.
- Computers and other devices will be cleaned after each use.
- Students who are sick or showing any symptoms of COVID-19, will be sent home.

Transitions

- Floor markings and signage will be placed around the school to direct traffic flow. Traffic flow instructions will be given to staff, students, and visitors.
- Traffic in the U Hall will be one way only (counterclockwise).
- Teachers will create procedures for movement around the classroom.
- Social distancing will be encouraged in the hallways during transitions by the administration faculty.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entry and exit points.
- Custodians will sanitize handrails, doorknobs, and other high touch areas between each transition.

Entry/Exit Points

- Entry and exit doors will be marked to minimize congestion.
- Visitors must wear masks and have their temperature taken before entering the building.
- Floor markings and signage will be placed around the school to direct traffic flow.
- Faculty, staff, and administration will discourage students from congregating or clustering together.
- Entry and exit doors will be sanitized throughout the school day.

Transportation

- All students riding the bus will be assigned seats.
- All students riding the bus will be required to wear a face mask or shield.

- Drivers will wear face coverings.
- Exceptions in unique student circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis.
- All busses will be sanitized at the end of each day or trip.

Restrooms

- Signage will be placed in all restrooms promoting handwashing, sanitation, and teaching proper handwashing techniques.
- Restrooms will be cleaned thoroughly throughout the day.
- High touch areas will be cleaned frequently.

Cafeteria

- 4th Period teachers will enter the school lunch ID before excusing students for lunch.
- Release times for lunch will be staggered by grade:
 - Group 1 released at 11:17 a.m.
 - Group 2 released at 11:27 a.m.
 - Group 3 released at 11:37 a.m.
- Release groups will rotate each week
- Teachers who teach Group 1 students will be on lunch duty.
- Entry and exit lines will be designated in the cafeteria.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for use in the lunch line.
- Students will have seating assignments in the cafeteria.
- Students will eat outside, weather permitting, and in the gym during inclement weather.

Large Gatherings/Assemblies

- We will not have any assemblies this year. Necessary assemblies--like the first day of school--will be made into videos and shared in individual classrooms.
- Spectators for sporting events will be required to wear masks and socially distance as family groups.

Unique Courses

- Larger rooms will be used to maintain social distancing
- Custodians will pay closer attention to these areas.
- PE classes will use masks at the teachers' discretion.

Outside Time During Lunch

- State and district guidelines will be followed regarding wearing masks outside.

Special Education

- Assigned seating will be used when practical.
- The District will provide face shields or coverings to Special Education teachers, speech and language pathologists, counselors, social workers, and related services providers.
- Reasonable accommodations will be provided for students that are unable to wear face coverings in required settings.
- Students will be provided necessary auxiliary aids / PPE to meet their educational and health needs within the least restrictive environment to the maximum extent appropriate.
