**b. Extracurricular Update**

- i. Wrestling – 2<sup>nd</sup> Place in tournament.

**d. Homework Lunch Update**

- i. Students with at least one F are invited to attend Homework Lunch. We group student by grade level and focus on specific classes and assignments. Any student is welcome to attend.

**e. 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Academic Report**

**l. Follow up on Council Concerns from previous meeting:**

1. Lockers – As a faculty and staff we believe the benefits of no lockers far outweighs the negative impacts of no lockers. Students have a PE locker. They do not have to carry heavy books to and from home. We are not planning to put lockers back into the hallways.
2. Additional Mirrors in the Girls locker room – There is limited wall space in the locker room. The plan is to add additional mirrors to the brick wall just inside the locker room across from the small office.
3. Hooks for hanging coats – We are in the process of finalizing the best location for coat hooks. At the bottom of the steps in the Commons Area is the most likely location. However, the concern is that students will leave valuable items in their coats when they hang them up. There is not a very secure area.
4. Increased opportunities for Honor Students – As we begin work on our schedule for next year we will look at the possibility of adding Honor Classes in Core areas. However, with the current number of faculty members, it is difficult to add additional sections of classes. We hope to address this concern partly through the prudent use of the additional Land Trust fund we will be receiving.

- Mastery Connect
  - One more year on our contract (\$2,800)
- Homework Class
  - After school. We could pay a teacher \$15 per hour
  - 1 teacher, twice a week for 2 hours each day = (about \$2,200)
  - Snacks (about \$550)
- Reading Materials for the reading class (Amount will depend on the program)
  - Update materials
  - Materials at a higher reading level

- Educational Field Trips (Grade Level)
